#### Institutions and policies that fit together

#### Institutions

- Markets
- ► Organizations (employers, employees)
- ► Routine consultations
- ► Welfare state

#### Policies

- ► International competition
- ► Solidarity negotiations wage compression
- ► Full employment
- ► Universalistic spedning



### Complementarity

- ▶ Impossibility (left and right)—Erosion
- ▶ Doing it twice —- Inefficient
- ► Institutional reciprocity —- Cumulative processes

#### Equality in the labor market

- ▶ 1930s— Crisis— Conflict between sheltered and exposed workers
- ► Substitutes vs complements
- supporters
- ▶ Magnitudes of wage compression (variance of log wages -1/4 of what it was 20 years before
- consequences:
  - elimination of industrial conflicts,
  - export orientation,
  - productivity enhancement—innovation,
  - political support for welfare spending
